TRIBAL COUNCIL RESOLUTION 2022- 19

AUTHORIZING PILOT FOR A NEW K-6 JEMEZ IMMERSION SCHOOL STARTING WITH THE 2021/22 SCHOOL YEAR

At a duly called meeting of the Tribal Council of the Pueblo of Jemez on the 30th day of June 200 following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, the Pueblo of Jernez is a federally recognized sovereign tribal government with a Governor and Tribal Council empowered to exercise all government powers, fiscal authority and tribal sovereigners and

WHEREAS, the Pueblo of Jemez is a federally recognized sovereign tribal government with a Governor and Tribal Council empowered to initiate and carry out programs for the

WHEREAS, the Pueblo of Jemez is committed to the provision of quality education and support services to the community and has directed the Pueblo of Jemez Department of

WHEREAS, the Pueblo of Jemez Tribal Council has made language maintenance programs and

WHEREAS, the Pueblo of Jennez Tribal Council recognizes the need to establish programs the focus on developing strategies for maintaining the language at current level increasing the theory level of marginal speakers, and developing current personner that are appropriate and consistent with protecting the culture, tradition and

WHEREAS, the Pueblo of Jemez Tribal Council recognizes that the work of the Jemez Department of Education and the Walstown Hood Start Language Immersion Program has resulted in the development of a Jemez Language & Culture Carticolam together with an Off Language Assessment, supported by the Tribal Council sanctioned Jemez Language Tema, and the outbilishments of short and long term Language.

WHEREAS, the Jemez Tribal Council has passed the following resolutions in support of Language and Culture based instruction, strategies and priorities:

2008: Arizona State University research partnership- Becoming Jemez 2012-36: Walatowa Head Start conversion to Jemez Language Immersion Program 2014-49: Authorizing development of strategic plant to implement a community wide Jemez Towa Language Immersion Program 2018-15: Endorsine the Platform developed by the Plaintiff's and Coalition

OW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Pueblo of Jennez Tribal Council authorizes the Jennez Department of Education to start a new Pilot K-6 Jennez Language Immersion school, and work to develop Jennez centered curriculum, assessments and evaluations, plus conduct all school events, moetings and related activities in the

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the pilot will begin with up to 10 students in the first year and adding 10 additional students in subsequent years (20 in year two; 30 in year three) to plan and accommodate for growth of the school, curriculum, assessments, programming, facilities and staffing.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Jenux Department of Education, Jenux Immersion Frograms and Immersions Schools will be supposed in necking additional facds and Frograms and Immersions Schools will be supposed in necking additional facds and previous schools are supposed for the properties of the pro

In our efforts to save our oral language, having a Towa Language Immersion Program will help sustain our identity as Hemish people. As a community, we need to come together to strengthen our Towa Language through lessons, storytelling, active listening and mentoring of our young Jemez minds. They are the leaders to carry forward our Hemish community.

A living, thriving language will sustain our

traditions, culture and ceremonial way of life.

AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM



A household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) if a member of the household meets at least one of the criteria below:

- Has an income that is at or below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines;
- Participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, SSI, WIC, or Lifeline;
- Participates in Tribal specific programs, such as Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribal TANF, or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations;
- Is approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision in the 2019-2020, 2020-2021, or 2021-2022 school year;
- · Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income program.




