Work is subject to performance under adverse environmental conditions, intense noise and in life threatening situations.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- Cuts and fells trees in accordance with instructions in thinning and logging operations; cuts limbs; stacks slash and debris; shrubs and vegetation
- Performs inventory and preventive maintenance checks of saws, vehicles, UTVs and equipment used in operations
- Observes, inspects and monitors the status and progress of the work; reports to the crew boss of hazards, issues, concerns and status of projects; maintains basic records of work performed
- Collects data for forest and fuels inventory; identify plant, shrub and tree species; use of forestry dendrometers, optic and electronic devices
- Assists with and supports prescribed burns
- Performs wildland firefighting duties; responds to initial attack of wildland fires on the Tribal trust lands; assists in fire suppression duties as required
- Applies herbicide to undesired vegetation with consideration of ecological impacts and safety
- Performs and assists with forestry labor activities such as construction of erosion control barriers, reforestation, cone collection, fence repair and new construction
- Observes safe work methods and uses safety equipment
- Participates in trainings to comply with policies and regulations
- Contributes to the overall quality of the unit's service provision by developing and coordinating work teams and by reviewing, recommending and implementing improved policies and procedures
- Represents the Pueblo with dignity, integrity, and a spirit of cooperation in all relationships with staff and the public
