Community Meetings



Language Team Meetings have discussed the correct translations and ways to say certain words. From these meetings they have worked to plan to rerecord previous songs taught to students.






Jemez Language Luncheons

Responsible for working with teachers to plan and implement individualized, daily educational instruction and


experiential programs for K-8th Grade students in a Jemez language immersion environment

Assists with the management and oversight of the Title VI Indian Education Federal Grant, student out of school and afterschool programming. Assist the Education Services Manager and Research Associate with Pre-College Programs, College & Career Advisement, Academic Enrichment Outreach, Fiber Optic Operation Support, Audio/Visual/Film Program, Coordinated School Health Program, and Intervention/Prevention Programs.





FAMILY SERVICES COORDINATOR

Performs duties to implement and coordinate social services and parent activities, providing direct intervention, case management and support to families enrolled in the Early Childhood Program (ECP). Establishes mutually respectful partnerships with families to promote and support parent and community involvement in a manner that meets the Head Start Performance Standards.
